Going forward the IPMJ editorial board hopes not only to nurture the well-established international nature of IPMJ, but also to increase both the social-science sophistication of research undertaken by public management scholars and the amount of research on public organizations by mainstream organization theory/behavior scholars. At the same time IPMJ will retain and strengthen its orientation toward prescriptive research that identifies ways to improve public-sector performance. And finally, although the journal has long been associated with ideas that are categorized under the rubric New Public Management (NPM), IPMJ aims to avoid adherence to a singular 'party line.'
